
Dear Friends in Christ,

The second aspect of our Parish Mission Statement is that we are to **EMBOLDEN ALL BELIEVERS**. Once again, our Next Generation Envisioning Team did not make this up. Saint Paul write in Romans 8, 31: *If God is for us, who can be against us?* Boldness is defined as a way of acting with confidence and courage. This is boldness and is it essential for us if we will be the Christians the Lord needs in 2023. We will be bold in living and proclaiming our faith. We will remain bold when people reject us for our faith. We will be bold even if persecution comes our way as it does for so many Christians throughout the world.

So...how do we become BOLD Christians? I suggest the following (which I borrowed from the website www.aboldchristian.com): (1) Be humble in knowing that boldness comes because we rely on the Lord and not ourselves (2) pray every day so that your connection with God is never lost (3) do not compare yourself to others – the devil uses this to weaken us – be the Christian God wants YOU to be (4) spend time with other Christians who are trying to be bold (5) set a goal to be bold in some area of your faith life (attend a Bible Study, tell people that you go to Mass each week and invite them to you, read a religious book in front of co-workers) (6) reject fear every day and (7) make praise part of your daily life as you say the word "Praise God" out loud even when you are not in Church.

What do you think? Can you strive to be a bolder Christian this week? It will help St. Cecilia lives its mission for our neighborhood!





HELPING SAINT CECILIA SCHOOL As you can imagine, the cost of a Catholic Education continues to increase. St. Cecilia School wants to continue to make this education affordable for families as we believe it is good for the child, our Church and society! Here are a few ways you can assist us in assisting families: RAISE RIGHT SCRIP PROGRAM allows us to purchase "gift cards" and a percentage of each card can go towards a child's tuition – if interested, contact Eleanor in the Parish Office. SPONSOR A CHILD PROGRAM allows you to pay a portion of a child's tuition for the

school year; you can donate \$5,000 for a full scholarship, \$2,500 for a half scholarship or \$1,250 for a partial scholarship – for more information contact <u>Sue in the Parish Office</u>. **TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS** allow you to re-direct your Pennsylvania Tax Dollars to a child's tuition if you pay the State more than \$1,000 in taxes (check your statements as you get them in January, you likely have that tax liability but it is withdrawn from your paycheck) – please help us in this way as it will make a HUGE impact in the life of our families – for more information contact Father Chris.

\$25 per person Morning coffee and lunch is included. It is estimated that one in five adults in the U.S. lives with a mental illness. Among children and teens, the numbers are increasing dramatically. This means that every parish and church institution - and many families - have members who struggle in this way, and often in silence. This workshop is designed to give parish leaders, as well as family members and friends, practical tools to help you support those who experience mental health struggles. Workshop topics include:

- · What do we mean by mental health struggles?
- How to walk alongside someone in a way that is sustainable and resourceful
- How to create space where people can share their struggles while remaining within the boundaries of our competence (e.g. acting as a friend, not a therapist)
- Question-Persuade-Refer Suicide Prevention Training: how to respond when someone may be thinking about suicide


