




Dear Friends in Christ,

Over the past few weeks I have shared my thoughts on the three aspects of our Parish Mission Statement (that we will *proclaim the Good News, embolden all believers and inspire a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ*). The final part of our Mission Statement addresses why we do these things – so that our parish will love and serve others generously.

At times I ask myself: "What is the place of a parish life Saint Cecilia in 2024?" As more and more parishes across the country and merged (or closed) it is obvious that the role of a local parish is not what is was for people 40, 60 or 80 years ago. People are not as observant in religious practice. They have opportunities for social engagement and education in places other than the parish. So why are we still here on Rhawn Street?

I believe it is so that we – every one of us – can love and serve other generously. It sounds radical (maybe even crazy), but in a world that is more and more selfish, self-centered, lonely, isolated and feeling forgotten it is being loved and serve that will most likely awaken them to the everlasting love of God. Our neighborhoods need St. Cecilia because they need to be loved and served. In order for St. Cecilia to do this – each one of us need to do it. Are you with me?





- Pray for peace in Ukraine, Russia, Israel, Gaza, Yemen, Nigeria and the streets of Philadelphia



HELPING SAINT CECILIA SCHOOL As you can imagine, the cost of a Catholic Education continues to increase. St. Cecilia School wants to continue to make this education affordable for families as we believe it is good for the child, our Church and society! Here are a few ways you can assist us in assisting families: RAISE RIGHT SCRIP PROGRAM allows us to purchase "gift cards" and a percentage of each card can go towards a child's tuition – if interested, contact Eleanor in the Parish Office. SPONSOR A CHILD PROGRAM allows you to pay a portion of a child's tuition for the school year; you can donate \$5,000 for a full scholarship, \$2,500 for a half

scholarship or \$1,250 for a partial scholarship – for more information contact <u>Sue in the Parish Office</u>. **TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS** allow you to re-direct your Pennsylvania Tax Dollars to a child's tuition if you pay the State more than \$1,000 in taxes (check your statements as you get them in January, you likely have that tax liability but it is withdrawn from your paycheck) – please help us in this way as it will make a HUGE impact in the life of our families – for more information contact Father Chris.





\$25 per person Morning coffee and lunch is included. It is estimated that one in five adults in the U.S. lives with a mental illness. Among children and teens, the numbers are increasing dramatically. This means that every parish and church institution - and many families - have members who struggle in this way, and often in silence. This workshop is designed to give parish leaders, as well as family members and friends, practical tools to help you support those who experience mental health struggles. Workshop topics include:

- · What do we mean by mental health struggles?
- How to walk alongside someone in a way that is sustainable and resourceful
- How to create space where people can share their struggles while remaining within the boundaries of our competence (e.g. acting as a friend, not a therapist)
- Question-Persuade-Refer Suicide Prevention Training: how to respond when someone may be thinking about suicide


